ADVICE TO DOG WALKERS

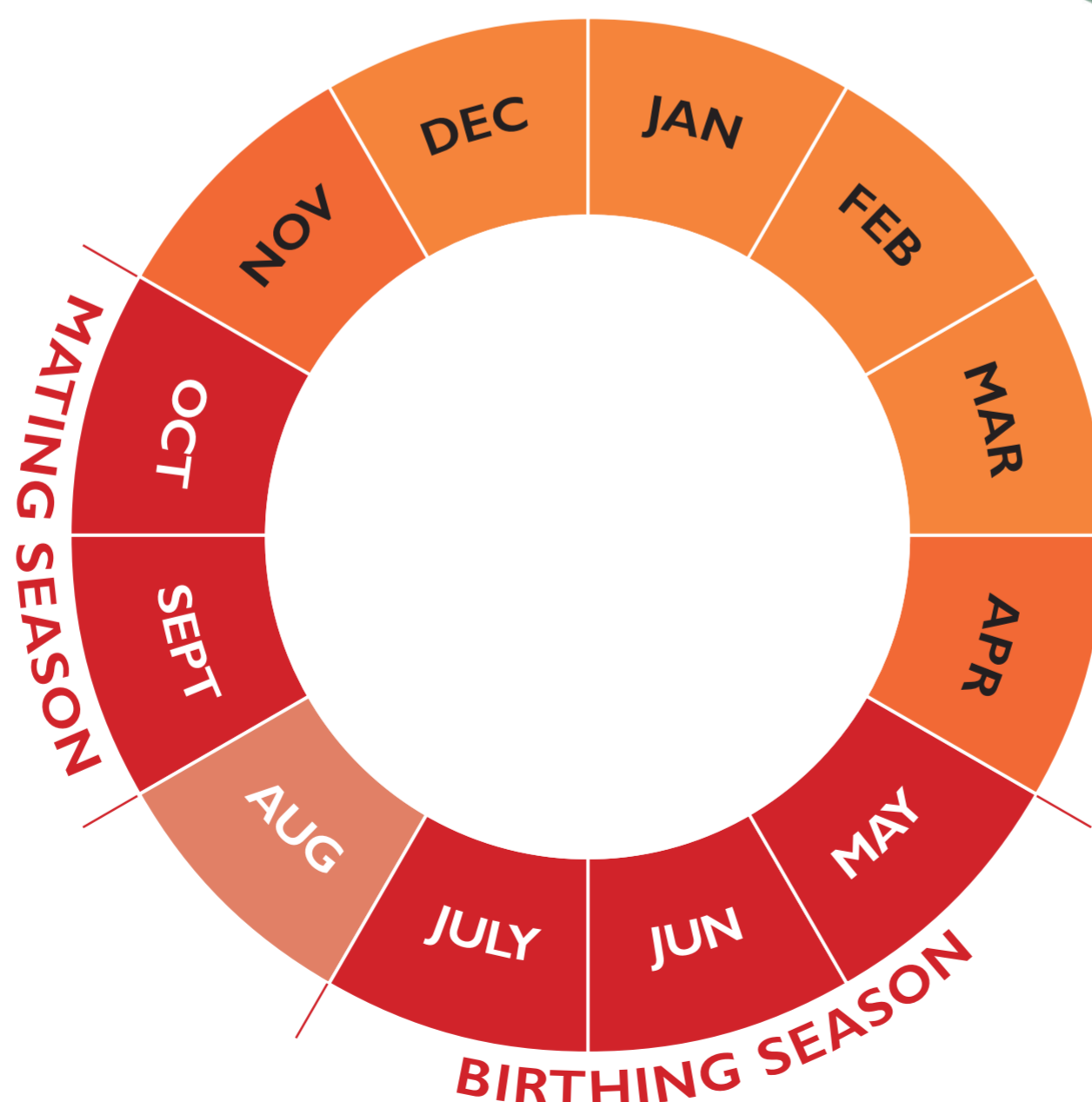
Deer can feel threatened by dogs even over long distances and when dogs are not behaving aggressively. This is particularly during the birthing (May to July) and mating (September to October) seasons. We recommend walking your dog outside the park at these times.

If you choose, at your own risk, to walk your dog in the park at these times, please keep your dog on a lead and consider an alternative route, such as following the wall line of the park where you are close to exit gates.

If pursued by deer, let go of the lead. Deer are less likely to attack if the dog runs away from them.

NEVER TOUCH OR MOVE YOUNG DEER – THEY ARE OFTEN LEFT ALONE BY THEIR MOTHERS BUT ARE NEVER ABANDONED

PLEASE PUT YOUR LITTER IN A BIN – DEER CHEW LITTER AND IT MAY CAUSE THEIR DEATH
